A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$70,802,446 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, to provide funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and capital and human resources development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 The purpose of this act is to Section 1. Purpose. 2 appropriate the sum of \$70,802,446, from the General Fund of the 3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending 4 September 30, 2023, for the purpose of funding the operations of 5 all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of 6 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and 7 contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development. The 8 National Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been 9 reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain 10 10 percent of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is 11 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education and for 12 Capital and Human Resources Development. The sum appropriated 13 herein shall be apportioned as follows:

Section 2. <u>Operating expenses of the Executive Branch</u>. The sum of \$27,580,642, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, for

15 Section 12. <u>Allotment and management of funds and lapse</u>
16 <u>dates</u>.

(1) General provisions.

(a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in accordance
with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial
Management Act of 1979.

(b) The allottees shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in this act, and that no bligations are incurred in excess of the sums appropriated.

(2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds appropriated by 1 2 this act are as follows: (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall be 3 4 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia; 5 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall be 6 the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia; (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall be 7 8 the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of 9 Micronesia: 10 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall be 11 the Public Auditor of the Federated States of Micronesia; 12 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these 13 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of 14 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following subsections 15 of sections 8 through 9 of this act: 16 (i) Section 8, subsection (11)(a) through (c) -17 the allottee of these funds is the Speaker of the FSM Congress; (ii) Section 8, subsection (12)(d) through (g) -18 19 the allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the 20 respective State Supreme Court; and 21 (ii) Section 9 (1)(a) through (d) - the allottee 22 of these funds is the President of COM-FSM. (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to 23 24 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of

25 September 30, 2023; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the authority to

1	obligate funds appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not
2	lapse.
3	Section 13. This act shall become law upon approval by the
4	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
5	becoming law without such approval.
