A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, to appropriate \$1,829,201 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide additional funding for the operations executive branch of the National Government; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resources Development; and for other purposes.
