A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 7, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221, 21-238 and 22-01, to appropriate \$1,960,535 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; Election Commission; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
