A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 8, 9, and 12, of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221, 21-238, 22-01, and 22-30 to appropriate \$65,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for Grants, Subsidies and Contributions, Capital and Human Resources Development, and to change the allottee of certain funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

The purpose of this act is to appropriate the sum of $\{74,887,351\}$ 74,952,351 from the 5 6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for 7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the 8 National Government of the Federated States of 9 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, 10 11 subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development. The National Government's share 12 13 of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; 14 EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain the 15 Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent 16 of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is

reflected in the budget for the Department of Education.
