
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 3 and 8 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, to appropriate \$850,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Legislative Branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; and Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, is hereby further
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of \$~~[77,249,238]~~ 78,099,238 from the
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, for the
8 purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the
9 National Government of the Federated States of
10 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants,
11 subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human
12 Resources Development. The National Government's share
13 of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero;
14 EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain the
15 Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent
16 of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is
17 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education.

1 The sum appropriated herein shall be apportioned as
2 follows:"

3 Section 2. Section 3 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by
4 Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, is hereby further
5 amended to read as follows:

6 "Section 3. Operating Expenses of the Legislative
7 Branch. The sum of \$[~~9,441,366~~] 10,141,366, or so much
8 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from
9 the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia
10 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, for the
11 operations of the Legislative Branch of the National
12 Government during fiscal year 2022. The sum appropriated
13 by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

14 (1) Speaker and Members.

15 The sum of \$3,850,181, or so much thereof as may be
16 necessary, for the operations of the Office of the
17 Speaker and Members of the Congress of the Federated
18 States of Micronesia during fiscal year 2022. The sum
19 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:

17 The sum of \$~~[2,390,000]~~ 3,090,000, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary, for the operations of the Congress
 19 delegation offices during the fiscal year 2022. Of the
 20 amounts appropriated for contractual services within
 21 each Delegation Office, up to a maximum of \$~~[160,000]~~
 22 210,000 per Member, at the Delegation Offices'
 23 discretion, may be used for Representation including
 24 prior years reimbursable expenses and other obligations.
 25 Any unexpended Representation funds shall lapse into the

1 FSM Trust Fund state sub-account of the respective state
 2 or states, which had remaining unexpended Representation
 3 funds. The sum appropriated is apportioned as follows:
