

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 19-10, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 19-26, 19-42, 19-51, 19-56, 19-72, 19-78, 19-96, 19-132, 19-163, 20-03, 20-25, 20-58, 20-76, 20-116, 21-29, 21-64, 21-196 and 22-10, by amending sections 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and extend the lapse date of funds previously appropriated therein, for the purpose of funding public projects and social programs in the states of Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Section 5 of Public Law No. 19-10, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 19-26, 19-51, 19-56, 19-72, 19-96, 19-163, 20-03,  
3 20-76, 21-196 and 22-10, is hereby further amended to read as  
4 follows:

5           "Section 5. Of the sum of \$2,800,000 appropriated by  
6 his act, \$1,200,000 is apportioned for public projects  
7 and social programs in the state of Chuuk.

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1 Section 2. Section 6 of Public Law No. 19-10, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 19-26, 19-42, 19-72, 19-96, 20-25, 20-116, 21-29,  
3 21-64, 21-196 and 22-10, is hereby further amended to read as  
4 follows:

5 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse  
6 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
7 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
8 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not  
9 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The  
10 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
11 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
12 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that  
13 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
14 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated  
15 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap  
16 State; PROVIDED THAT, the allottee of funds appropriated  
17 under subsection 2(h) of this act shall be the President  
18 of COM-FSM. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
19 sections 3 and 4 of this act shall be the President of  
20 the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee;  
21 PROVIDED THAT, the allottee of funds appropriated under  
22 subsections 3(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h),  
23 (i), (j) and (k) of this act shall be the Mayor of Lelu  
24 Town Government; the allottee of funds appropriated  
25 under subsection 3(y) of this act shall be the Mayor of

1           Tafunsak Municipal Government or his designee; the  
2           allottee of funds appropriated under subsections  
3           4(1)(a), 4(1)(b), 4(2)(g) and 4(2)(h) shall be the  
4           Secretary of the Department of Transportation,  
5           Communications and Infrastructure; the allottee of funds  
6           appropriated under subsections 4(2)(i), 4(3)(a), 4(3)(b)  
7           and 4(3)(d) of this act shall be the Pohnpei  
8           Transportation Authority; and the allottee of funds  
9           appropriated under subsections 4(3)(f) and 4(3)(h) of  
10          this act shall be the Pohnpei Utility Corporation. The  
11          allottee of funds appropriated under subsections 5(1),  
12          5(3) and 5(6) of this act shall be the Governor of Chuuk  
13          State or his designee. The allottee of funds  
14          appropriated under subsection 5(2) of this act shall be  
15          the Mortlock Islands Development Authority. The  
16          allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(4) of  
17          this act shall be the Southern Namoneas Development  
18          Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
19          subsection 5(5) of this act shall be the Faichuk  
20          Development Authority. The authority of the allottee to  
21          obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on  
22          September 30, 2024.”

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1           Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming  
3 law without such approval.
