AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 22-153, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-169, 22-181 and 22-204, to appropriate \$1,820,452 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive, Legislative the Judiciary branches and Grants, Subsidies and Contributions of the National Government, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-153, as amended
- 2 by Public Laws Nos. 22-169 and 22-181, is hereby further amended
