## AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 23-24 in order to appropriate supplemental funding in the amount of \$22,107,281 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, for the operations of all branches of the National Government; Public Auditor; Agencies of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resources Development; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

6	"Section 12. Allotment and management of funds and
7	lapse dates.
8	(1) General provisions.
9	(a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
10	allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
11	accordance with applicable law, including, but not
12	limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.
13	(b) The allottees shall be responsible for
14	ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
15	necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
16	this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
17	of the sums appropriated.
18	(2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
19	appropriated by this act are as follows:
20	(a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall
21	be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;
22	(b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall
23	be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States
24	of Micronesia;
25	(c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall

1	be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
2	Federated States of Micronesia;
3	(d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall
4	be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
5	Micronesia;
6	(e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these

8	Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
9	subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:
10	(i) Section 9 (1)(a) through (c) — the
11	allottee of these funds shall be the President of the
12	College of Micronesia-FSM;
13	(ii) Section 8 (8)(b) - the allottee of these
14	funds shall be the Governor of the State of Kosrae;
15	(iii) Section 8 (8)(c) — the allottee of these
16	funds shall be the Governor of the State of Pohnpei;
17	(iv) Section 8 (8)(d) — the allottee of these
18	funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;
19	(v) Section 8 (8)(e) - the allottee of these
20	funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;
21	(vi) Section 8 (11) — the allottee of these
22	funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
23	Federated States of Micronesia;
24	(vii) Section 8 (12)(h) - the allottee of these
25	funds shall be the President of the College of

2	(viii) Section 8 (12)(j) through $(m)$ - the
3	allottee of these funds shall the Chief Justice of the
4	respective State Supreme Courts;
5	(ix) Section 8 (12)(n) — the allottee of these
6	funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
7	the Federated States of Micronesia;
8	(x) Section 8 (12)(x) — the allottee of these
9	funds shall be the Chief executive Officer of OAE;
10	(xi) Section 9 (10)(g) — the allottee of these
11	funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
12	the Federated States of Micronesia.
13	(3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
14	obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
15	of September 30, 2024; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
16	appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not
17	lapse.
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1	Section 10.	This act shall become law upon approval by the
2	President of the	e Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
