A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 102 and 103 of title 10 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 2-61, to eliminate the requirement that the representative must have specific authority commit the Government of the Trust Territory of the before he can Pacific Islands; to substitute the term "Federated States of Micronesia" for "Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands"; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 102 of title 10 of the Code of the Federated

States of Micronesia, Public Law No. 2-61, is hereby further amended

3 to read as follows:

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"Section 102. Representative-Powers and duties. Representative shall maintain the office headquarters in Washington, D.C., and shall have the power to employ such secretarial, clerical, technical, and professional assistance as he may deem necessary to the fulfilling of his duties and responsibilities, subject to appropriations for his office. He shall represent the people of the Federated States of Micronesia on a full-time basis before the Congress of the United States and before the various departments and agencies of the Federal Government and other organizations, public and private, on all matters pertaining to the Federated States of Micronesia, and shall actively and fully advocate all programs and policies duly adopted by the Government of the Federated States of Micronesia. We shall not bind of condit the covernment of the Itake Tettitoty of the Pacific Islands without specific ΔνtΝφτity tφ Φφ \$φ. He shall also assist the public officials of the Federated States of Micronesia with respect to all matters necessary and pertaining to the conduct of their offices, and shall render a written report on his activities to the Secretary of the Department of External Affairs once a year during the first regular session of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia of each calendar year beginning in 1981. The

. 1		Secretary shall forthwith deliver the report to the Congress
2		of the Federated States of Micronesia. The Representative shall
3		be subject to the direction of the President of the Federated
4		States of Micronesia on the conduct of his office and shall
5		submit a monthly report of his activities to him."
6	Section	on 2. Section 103 of title 10 of the Code of the Federated
7	States of	Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 2-61, is hereby
8	further an	mended to read as follows:
9		"Section 103. Representative-Compensation. The Representative
10		shall be paid an annual salary \$24,000, which salary shall not
11		be diminished during his tenure of office. In addition thereto,
12		he shall receive an allowance each fiscal year for secretarial,
13		clerical, technical, and professional assistance, and for all
14		office expenses, including office rental and equipment, and
15		such other and further expenses as may be allowed by the
16		Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia by appropriation.
17		The Representative and his family shall be permitted one paid
18		round trip from Washington to the Ttwst Tettltoty of the
19		Pacific 1:14/4 Federated States of Micronesia every two years
20		in addition to his own travel on official business. He shall
21		be entitled to the same benefits as the members of the cabinet
22		of the President. For travel on official business he shall be
23		entitled to receive the standard Federated States of Micronesia
24		rates of per diem and actual travel costs."
