A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend section 101 of title 3 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia to change the reapportionment timetable, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 101 of title 3 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: 3 "Section 101. Membership and terms of office. The Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia shall be a unicameral National legislature consisting of fourteen Members to be known as Senators as follows: (1) four at-large Members, one from each of the States of Kosrae, Ponape, Truk, and Yap, who are elected on the basis of State equality to serve for a four-year term. (2) ten Members serving for a term of two years and 10 11 elected on the basis of population as follows: 12 (a) one Member elected from Kosrae as a single-13 member congressional district; (b) one Member elected from Yap as a single-member 14 15 congressional district; 16 (c) three Members elected from Ponape, one of whom 17 representing each single-member congressional district; 18 (d) five Members elected from Truk, one of whom 19 representing each single-member congressional district. 20 (3) Single-member congressional districts shall be 21 reapportioned at least every ten years. The fift such teappottionnent shall be hade in-1989/ 22 23 (4) Each Senator elected at large shall hold office for a term of four years. Senators elected on the basis of 24

population shall each hold office for a term of two years.

The terms of office of all Members of the Congress of the 2 Federated States of Micronesia shall commence at noon on the 3 tenth day of May following their election, except as other-4 wise provided by law. Any Member elected or appointed to 5 fill a vacancy shall serve only for the unexpired term of the person he succeeds." Section 2.
