## A RESOLUTION

To uniformly authorize that the sum of \$214,263 be taken from the Trust Territory Social Security Retirement Fund for the purpose of supplementing the transition expenses of the Trust Territory Social Security administration for fiscal year 1985.

- 1 WHEREAS, section 6 of Secretarial Order No. 3027 and section 6, as
- 2 amended, of Secretarial Order No. 3039 provide for the continuing effect
- 3 on a Trust Territory-wide basis of Trust Territory Social Security laws;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Trust Territory Social Security administration is
- 6 authorized to make expenditures not to exceed 12 percent of total annual
- 7 contributions and deductions received by the system; and
- 8 WHEREAS, any additional funds above the 12 percent ceiling required
- 9 for Social Security administration which fall outside normal operations
- 10 must be approved by resolution of the Congress of the Federated States
- 11 of Micronesia; and
- WHEREAS, \$2:14,263 is needed to defray the cost of a transition plan
- 13 which is essential so that successor systems may be established after
- 14 termination of the Trusteeship Agreement; now, therefore,
- 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Third Congress of the Federated States of
- 16 Micronesia, Fourth Regular Session, 1984, that the sum of \$214,263, or
- 17 so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be available to the Trust
- 18 Territory Social Security Board for the purpose of supplementing transition
- 19 expenses of the Social Security administration for fiscal year 1985. Any
- 20 balance which is unexpended or unobligated at the end of the fiscal year
- 21 shall revert to the Trust Territory Retirement Fund; and
- 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect upon
- 23 its uniform adoption by the Olbiil Era Kelulau, the Marshall Islands
