## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 2-65, as amended by Public Law No. 4-4, by amending section 2(e) relating to the definition of citizen bidder; by amending sections 5(a), (b), and (c) and by deleting section 5(d); by amending section 10 by adding new subsections (1), (2), (3), and (4) relating to requirements for citizen labor and domestic purchase of materials to be inserted into all contracts for construction; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 2-65, as amended by
2	Public Law No. 4-4, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
3	"Section 2. <u>Definitions</u> .
4	(1) 'Citizen bidder' means:
5	(a) Until the termination of the Trusteeship,
6	any business in which at least 51 percent of the interest
7	therein is owned by a citizen or citizens of the Trust
8	Territory of the Pacific Islands;
9	(b) Upon termination of the Trusteeship, any
10	business in which at least 51 percent of the interest
11	therein is owned by a citizen or citizens of the
12	Federated States of Micronesia;
13	(c) Until the termination of the Trusteeship,
14	a business which has been a resident of the Trust
15	Territory of the Pacific Islands for at least 1 year
16	immediately prior to the submission of its bid;
17	(d) Upon termination of the Trusteeship, a
18	business which has been a resident of the Federated
19	States of Micronesia for at least 1 year immediately
20	prior to the submission of its bid; and
21	(e) Upon termination of the Trusteeship, a
22	business which has paid gross revenue taxes to the
23	Federated States of Micronesia for the 1-year period
24	inimediately prior to 4 quarters immediately preceding
25	the submission of it's bid its written notice of

1	intention to bid.
2	(2) 'Contracting officer' means the official in
3	charge of letting a contract for a National Government
4	agency.
5	(3) 'Lowest responsible bidder' means the lowest
6	bidder whose offer adequately responds in quality,
7	fitness, and capacity to the particular requirements of
8	the proposed work called for by the contract.
9	(4) 'National Government agency' means any branch,
10	department, office, division, board, bureau, commission,
11	committee, institution, or authority of the National
12	Government of the Federated States of Micronesia."
13	Section 2. Section 5 of Public Law No. 2-65, as amended by
14	Public Law No. 4-4, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
15	"Section 5. Eligibility. In order for a bidder to be
16	eligible to receive the citizen bidder preference
17	provided for in section 4 of this act, such bidder shall
18	meet the following criteria:
19	(a) The bidder shall be a citizen bidder as
20	defined under section 2(1) of this act;
21	(b) The bidder shall be bidding for a
22	construction project or for the sale of personal property
23	in response to an advertisement for bids made pursuant to
24	this act; and
25	(c) The bidder shall include in his written

1	notice of intention to bid a statement that he is
2	submitting his bid as a citizen bidder and provide
3	sufficient documentation of his eligibility to receive
4	the citizen bidder preference, and."
5	(d) Fot constituction projects, the biddet shall
6	commit that until the tethination of the Ttusteeship, at
7	least 18 percent of all workers employed at all times at
8	the job site shall be citizens of the Trust Tettitoty of
9	the Pacific Islands, that upon tethination of the
10	Tłusteeshipi at least 28 peteent of all workets employed
11	at the job site at all times shall be citizens of the
, 12	Fedetated States of Mictonesial and that at Ieast 23
13	petcent of all materials and supplies utilized in the
14	constituction project shall be putchased from within the
15	Fedetated States of Mictonesialy
16	Section 3. Section 10 of Public Law No. 2-65, as amended by
17	Public Law No. 4-4, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
18	"Section 10. Written contract awarded to lowest
19	responsible bidder.
20	(1) All contracts shall be in writing and shall be
21	executed by the National Government agency which is
22	authorized to let contracts in its own name and shall be
23	made with the lowest responsible bidder. If the lowest
24	bid is rejected, the contracting officer may, at his
25	discretion, award the contract to the lowest remaining

1	responsible bidder or advertise anew for bids pursuant to
2	section 9 of this act. In each instance the officer, at
3	his discretion, after determining the lowest responsible
4	bidder, may negotiate with that bidder, and that bidder
5	only, to reduce the scope of work and to award the
6	contract at a price which reflects the reduction in the
7	scope of work.
8	(2) For all construction contracts awarded pursuant
9	to this act, the contracting officer shall require that
10	the following requirements be made conditions of the
11	contract:
12	(a) At least 25 percent of all materials and
13	supplies utilized in the construction project shall be
14	purchased from sources within the Federated States of
15	Micronesia;
16	(b) Until the termination of the Trusteeship,
17	at least 25 percent of all workers employed at all times
18	at the job site shall be citizens of the Trust Territory
19	of the Pacific Islands; and
20	(c) After termination of the Trusteeship, at
21	least 25 percent of all workers employed at all times at
22	the job site shall be citizens of the Federated States of
23	Micronesia.
24	(3) The contracting officer shall have the
25	discretion to increase the percentage of citizen workers

1	who must be employed at the job site pursuant to
2	subsections (2)(b) and (c), and to increase the
3	percentage of materials and supplies which must be
4	purchased from sources within the Federated States of
5	Micronesia pursuant to subsection (2)(a).
6	(4) The contracting officer shall have the
7	authority to waive or relax the requirements of
8	subsection (2) upon a showing that the contractor has
9	made a good faith effort to meet the requirements set
10	forth in subsection (2), but, due to a lack of workers,
11	supplies, or materials, or due to other circumstances
12	beyond his control, has been unable to do so."
13	Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the
14	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
15	becoming law without such approval.
