A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend section 4 of Public Law No. 3-83 to allow for appointment of two alternate members for each board member of the Federated States of Micronesia Environmental Protection Board, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 4 of Public Law No. 3-83 is hereby amended
2 to read as follows:

3 "Section 4. Federated States of Micronesia Environmental
4 Protection Board created; Membership; Terms; Vacancies;
5 Chairman; Vice chairman; Records; Qualifications.

6 (1) There is hereby established in the Office of the
7 President a board to be known as the Federated States of
8 Micronesia Environmental Protection Board to be composed of
9 five members as follows: one member and two alternate
10 members from each of the four States of the Federated
11 States of Micronesia and one member and two alternate
12 members to be appointed by the President. Each member
13 shall be appointed for a term of 2 years, and may be
14 reappointed for one additional 2-year term. Vacancies
15 shall be filled in the same manner as the original
16 appointment was made, for the unexpired term.

17 (2) The Board shall elect from among its members a
18 chairman and a vice chairman. The President shall
19 designate a member to serve as temporary chairman of the
20 Board until such time as the Board shall elect a chairman.

21 (3) The Board shall provide for the keeping of all of
22 its records and actions. These records shall be open to
23 the public for public inspection.

24 (4) The President shall make his appointments
25 based upon the ~~appointees' ability~~ appointees' abilities



4 Section 2. This act shall become law upon approval by the
5 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
6 becoming law without such approval.
