A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-20, 5-37, and 5-72, by further amending sections 502 and 503, as amended by Public Law No. 5-37, for the purpose of increasing the civil and criminal fines set forth therein, and for other purposes.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA: Section 1. Section 502 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated 1 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 "Section 502. Civil penalties. 3 (1) Any person who is found by the Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia in a civil proceeding 5 to have committed an act prohibited by section 501 of this 6 chapter shall be liable to the Federated States of Micro-7 nesia for a civil penalty. 8 (2) The amount of the civil penalty shall not be 9 €x6€€d less than \$1,000,000500,000 for each violation. Each 10 day of a continuing violation shall constitute a separate 11 offense. 12 (3) In determining the amount of such penalty, the 1.3 Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia 14 shall take into account the nature, circumstances, 15 extent, and gravity of the prohibited acts committed 16 and, with respect to the violator, the degree of 17 culpability, any history of prior offenses, and such other 18 19 matters as justice may require.
 - (4) The Attorney General of the Federated States of Micronesia is authorized to initiate all proceedings under this section and to recover the amount assessed as a civil penalty.
 - (5) The proceeds of civil penalties shall be deposited into the General Fund of the Federated States of

1	Micronesia. Fifty percent of these proceeds from civil
2	penalties shall then be distributed to the State affected."
3	Section 2. Section 503 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated
4	States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 5-37, is hereby
5	further amended to read as follows:
6	"Section 503. Criminal penalties.
7	(1) A person is guilty of an offense if he commits
8	any act prohibited by section 501 of this chapter.
9	(2) Any offense described as a prohibited act by
10	subsections (1)(a), (b), (c), (g), or (i) of section 501 is
11	punishable by a fine of not mote less than \$2504000 500,000.
12	(3) Any offense described as a prohibited act by
13	subsections (1)(d), (e), (f), or (h) of section 501 is
14	punishable by a fine of not white less than \$400,000 800,000,
15	or imprisonment for not more than two years, or both;
16	PROVIDED that if in the commission of any such offense the
17	person uses a dangerous weapon, engages in conduct that
18	causes bodily injury to any officer authorized to enforce
19	the provisions of this title, or threatens any such officer
20	with bodily injury, the offense is punishable by a fine of
21	not mote less than \$1 million, or imprisonment for not more
22	than ten years, or both; and PROVIDED FURTHER that where a
23	regional fisheries treaty so requires, persons arrested for
24	violating any provisions of, or regulations under, such
25	treaty shall not be subject to imprisonment.

1	(4) Any offense described as a prohibited act by
2	subsection (2) of section 501 is punishable by a fine of
3	not #6t¢ less than \$400,000 800,000. Each day of
4	continuing violation shall be considered a separate
5	offense."
6	Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the
7	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
8	law without such approval.
