A RESOLUTION

Requesting and urging the President of the Federated States of Micronesia to cross-accredit His Excellency, Masao Nakayama, FSM Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to Japan, as Head of Diplomatic Mission to Republic of Korea, People's Republic of China and other Asian countries with which the FSM establishes diplomatic relations.

1 WHEREAS, article 5 of the Vienna Convention on
2 Diplomatic Relations permits the head of mission to one
3 country to be accredited to other countries; and

4 WHEREAS, the Congress of the Federated States of
5 Micronesia has ratified the Vienna Convention; and

6 WHEREAS, cross-accrediting His Excellency, Masao
7 Nakayama to certain Asian countries is found to be
8 convenient for geographical reasons; and

9 WHEREAS, because of limited monetary resources in the
10 FSM to establish residential Missions in other countries, it
11 is the desire to limit expenditure by cross-accreditation;


13 WHEREAS, it is of great importance for the FSM to
14 establish and continue diplomatic ties with other countries
15 for political and economic advantages; now, therefore,

16 BE IT RESOLVED by the Seventh Congress of the Federated
17 States of Micronesia, Third Regular Session, 1992, that the
18 Congress hereby requests and urges the President of the
19 Federated States of Micronesia to cross-accredit His
20 Excellency, Masao Nakayama, resident Ambassador to Japan,
21 when appropriate, as head of mission to Republic of Korea,
22 People's Republic of China and other Asian countries that
23 the FSM establishes diplomatic relations with; and
