## AN ACT

To further amend title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, by adding a new section 210 in order to establish a Foreign Assistance Fund as authorized by article XII, section 1(b) of the Constitution, by renumbering sections 210 through 227, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Title 55 of the Code of the Federated States of
- 2 Micronesia is hereby further amended by adding a new section 210 of
- 3 chapter 2 to read as follows:
- 4 "Section 210. Foreign Assistance Fund.
- 5 (1) Definitions.

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- (a) 'Agreement' means an agreement in any form entered into by any official of the National Government or its designee for the acceptance or receipt of foreign financial assistance or aid on behalf of any National or State governmental entity.
- (b) 'Foreign financial assistance' means any foreign aid or assistance, whether in the form of currency, goods, services, loans or other tangible or intangible assets, offered to the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia or to any individual State or States within the Federated States of Micronesia by any foreign government, other than foreign aid or assistance required by law to be deposited in the General Fund or the Program Fund, or the Compact Financial Assistance Fund.

  Nothing in this act shall be interpreted to preclude any State or States within the Federated States of Micronesia from entering into agreements for financial assistance from any private person or entity.
  - (2) Approval by Congress. Any agreement for the

acceptance or receipt of foreign financial assistance shall be submitted to the Congress of the Federated States of micronesia by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia no later than the next session of Congress following such agreement, for approval by resolution.

- within the National Treasury of the Federated States of Micronesia a Foreign Assistance Fund which shall receive and record all foreign financial assistance as defined in subsection (1) of this section pursuant to the Financial Management Act of 1979. The President or his designee shall notify Congress of the receipt of foreign assistance and the deposit of such assistance or the equivalent expressed in U.S. dollars to the Fund, no later than the next session of Congress following such receipt. Initially, the Fund shall consist of all prior year unobligated balances of foreign assistance funds and all foreign assistance funds designated for the National Government and made available beginning October 1, 1994.
- (4) <u>Development Assistance Unit</u>. The President shall establish a Development Assistance Unit within the investment group of the Department of Finance, which unit shall actively seek foreign assistance funding upon approval of the President, foster productive use of foreign
