

EIGHTH CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FIRST SPECIAL SESSION, 1994

C.B. NO. 8-235

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, by further amending section 404, as amended by Public Law No. 6-11, to require foreign fishing boats to refuel at FSM ports, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section 1. Section 404 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of
2	Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 6-11, is hereby further amended to
3	read as follows:
4	"Section 404. Foreign fishing agreements - Terms. All foreign fishing
5	agreements shall have the following minimum terms:
6	(1) The foreign party and the owner or operator of any fishing
7	vessel shall acknowledge the exclusive fishery management authority of
8	the Federated States of Micronesia within the exclusive economic zone;
9	(2) The foreign party or the owner or operator of any fishing
10	vessel fishing, as appropriate, pursuant to such agreement shall;
1 1	(a) comply with the requirements of this title, all regulations
12	issued pursuant to this title and all other applicable laws and regulations;
13	(b) permit any officer authorized to enforce the provisions of
14	this title to board and search or inspect any vessel at any time and make
15	arrests and seizures provided for in section 508 of this title whenever
16	such officer has reasonable cause to believe, as a result of such a search
17	or inspection, that any such vessel or any person has committed an act
18	prohibited by this title;
19	(c) permit such officer to examine and make negotiations on
20	any permit issued pursuant to sections 109 through 111 of this title, or
2 1	other documentation required under any applicable foreign fishing
22	agreement;
23	(d) allow and assist any authorized officer to enforce the
24	provisions of this title, regulations made thereunder and any other
25	applicable laws and regulations:

1 (e) immediately comply with every instruction given by an 2 authorized officer, facilitate safe boarding, and facilitate the inspection of 3 the vessel, gear, equipment, records, fish and fish products; 4 (f) allow and assist authorized observers to board the vessel 5 for scientific, monitoring, compliance and other functions, and have full 6 access to, and the use of, facilities and equipment on board the vessel 7 which the authorized observer may determine is necessary to carry out 8 his duties; have full access to the bridge, fish on board and areas which 9 may be used to hold, process, weigh and store fish; remove samples; have 10 full access to the vessel's records, including its logs and documentation 1 1 for the purpose of inspection and copying; and gather any other 12 information relating to fisheries in the exclusive economic zone; 13 (g) not assault, obstruct, resist, delay, refuse boarding to, 14 intimidate, or interfere with an authorized officer or authorized observer 15 in the performance of his duties; 16 (h) display any permit or permit number issued for any such 17 vessel pursuant to sections 109 through 111 of this title or any 18 documentation required to be displayed under foreign fishing agreements 19 in the wheelhouse of such vessel; 20 (i) ensure that appropriate position-fixing and identification 21 equipment shall be installed and maintained in working order on each such 22 vessel; 23 (i) ensure that the vessel is marked in accordance with 24 regulations issued by the Authority while within the exclusive economic 25 zone;

1	(k) require that the National Government of the Federated
2	States of Micronesia shall be reimbursed for the cost of authorized
3	observers;
4	(I) appoint and maintain an agent within the Federated States
5	of Micronesia who is authorized to receive and respond to any legal
6	process issued in the Federated States of Micronesia with respect to such
7	owner or operator of such vessel; and
8	(m) not, in any year, exceed such party's allocation of the
9	total allowable level of foreign fishing, in the event allocations are
10	established in accordance with this title/; and
1 1	(n) not refuel or take on fuel, within 72 hours of entering or
1 2	leaving the exclusive economic zone, except from an on-shore fuel
1 3	distributor at a port within the Federated States of Micronesia.
1 4	(3) Foreign parties will:
1 5	(a) apply, pursuant to section 109 of this title, for any
16	required permits;
17	(b) deliver promptly to the owner or operator of the
18	appropriate fishing vessel any permit which is issued under that section
19	for such vessel; and
20	(c) abide by the requirement that no foreign fishing will be
2 1	permitted in the exclusive economic zone without a valid and applicable
22	permit, except as provided by foreign fishing agreements concluded
23	pursuant to this chapter, and that all conditions and restrictions of the
24	permit, or any applicable foreign fishing agreement, are complied with."
