A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$7/77\$/\$\$\$\$\frac{100,000}{000}\$ from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, for the purpose of flipping/ salipping/ fencing/ and administering construction of the new Palikir Campus and the State campuses of the College of Micronesia-FSM, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- Section 1. The sum of \$2/226/999 = 100,000, or so much thereof as
- 2 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
- 3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September
- 4 30, 1994, for the purpose of flythishing, equipping, fencing, and
- 5 administering construction of the new Palikir Campus and the State

- 17 Section 2. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
- 18 allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with
- 19 applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial
- 20 Management Act of 1979. The allottee shall be responsible for
- 21 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary,
- 22 are used solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that no
- 23 obligations are incurred in excess of the sum appropriated. The
- 24 authority of the allottee to obligate funds appropriated by this act
- 25 shall lapse as of September 30, 1997.
