## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 24 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, by further amending sections 501 and 503, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-37 and 6-11; and by further amending section 502, as amended by Public Law No. 6-37, all for the purpose of changing certain prohibited acts and penalties for violations of the fisheries laws, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1	Section 1. Section 501 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States
2	of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-37 and 6-11, is hereby further
3	amended to read as follows:
4	"Section 501. Prohibited acts.
5	(1) It is unlawful for any person:
6	(a) to violate any provision of <b>th/i/s /t/t/∳</b> <u>a fishing</u>

8	regulation by permit issued pursuant to this title;

boarding to, intimidate, or interfere with any authorized officer or authorized observer in performance of his duties, including in the conduct of any search or inspection described in paragraph (e) of this subsection; and for the purposes of this subparagraph, any person who refuses to allow any authorized officer or observer, or any person acting under his order or in his aid, to exercise any of the powers conferred on an authorized officer or observer by this title or any regulations made under this title shall be deemed to be obstructing that officer, observer, or person;

requirements of any authorized officer or observer;

particulars which, to his knowledge, are false or misleading in any respect;

about to be boarded by any authorized officer, to throw overboard or destroy any fish, fishing gear, explosive, poison, or other noxious substance to avoid seizure of such fish, fishing gear, explosive, poison, or other noxious substance or thing or to avoid the detection of any offense under this title or the regulations made under this title;

/(j) (g) to resist a lawful arrest for any act

2	(h) to provide information required to be
3	recorded, notified or communicated pursuant to any requirement
4	of the provisions of this title or the regulations, knowing or having
5	reasonable cause to believe that it is false, incomplete or
6	misleading;
7	(i) to knowingly ship, transport, offer for sale,
8	sell, purchase, import, export, or have custody, control, or
9	possession of any fish taken or retained in violation of this title or
10	any regional fishing treaty, regulation, permit, foreign or domestic-
11	based fishing agreement or any applicable law;
12	(j) to interfere with, delay, or prevent, by any
13	means, the apprehension or arrest of another person, knowing
14	that such person has committed any act prohibited by this
15	section;
16	(n) (k) to violate any provision of, or regulation
17	under, any applicable agreement to implement a regional fisheries
18	treaty, or any other treaty, agreement or arrangement having
19	effect in the Federated States of Micronesia, entered into
20	pursuant to section 106 of this title;
21	(I) to use any foreign fishing vessel for fishing
22	within a two-mile radius of any fish aggregating device of the
23	Government, a citizen, or any other body established under the
24	laws of the Federated States of Micronesia. J: or
25	(m) to violate any provision of this title.

1	(2) It is unlawful for any fishing vessel, and for the crew,
2	owner, or operator of any fishing vessel, to engage in fishing in the
3	<b>∉</b> Exclusive <b>∉</b> Economic <b>⊭</b> Zone <b>aμthoriz∉d by and ασηθιμοίεα /in</b>

5	permit issued pursuant to this title or after revocation, or during
6	the period of suspension of a permit issued pursuant to this title,

9	106."
10	Section 2. Section 502 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States
11	of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 6-37, is hereby further amended
12	to read as follows:
13	"Section 502. <u>Civil penalties</u> .
14	(1) Any person who is found by the Supreme Court of
15	the Federated States of Micronesia in a civil proceeding to have
16	committed an act prohibited by section 501 of this chapter shall
17	be liable to the Federated States of Micronesia for a civil penalty.
18	(2) The amount of the civil penalty shall not exceed
19	\$5,000,000 for each violation, except as otherwise provided
20	herein. Each day of a continuing violation shall constitute a
21	separate offense. The Supreme Court of the Federated States of
22	Micronesia may impose a penalty in excess of \$5,000,000
23	provided, in its review of the factors set forth in subsection (3),
24	the Supreme Court finds that the defendant has committed a

gross violation.

In determining the amount of such penalty, the

1	Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia shall take
2	into account the nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of the
3	prohibited acts committed and, with respect to the violator, the
4	degree of culpability, any history of prior offenses, and whether
5	any other civil or criminal fine or any imprisonment has been
6	imposed as a result of the specific conduct which has given rise to
7	this action, and such other matters as justice may require.
8	(4) The Attorney General of the Federated States of
9	Micronesia is authorized to initiate all proceedings under this
10	section and to recover the amount assessed as a civil penalty.
11	(5) The proceeds of civil penalties shall be deposited into
12	the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia. Fifty
13	percent of these proceeds from civil penalties shall then be
14	distributed to the State affected."
15	Section 3. Section 503 of title 24 of the Code of the Federated States
16	of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-37 and 6-11, is hereby further
17	amended to read as follows:
18	"Section 503. Criminal penalties.
19	(1) A person is guilty of an offense if he commits any
20	act prohibited by section 501 of this chapter.
21	(2) <u>Unless otherwise provided</u> , A any offense described
22	as a prohibited act by subsections (1)(a), (1)(i), (1)(k), or (1)(l)
23	(b), (4),/(d),/ (ly), (k),/ (l),/(n)//4//(4) of section 501 is
24	punishable by a fine <b>pf</b> not <b>less /than</b> to exceed <b>\$57991990</b>
25	<u>\$50,000</u> .

Unless otherwise provided, A any offense described 1 (3) as a prohibited act by subsections (1)( $\phi$ ), (f), (g), (i), (j),  $\phi$ 2 (m) (1)(b), (1)(c), (1)(d), (1)(e), (1)(f), (1)(g), (1)(h), or (1)(i) 3 of section 501 is punishable by a fine that not less than to 4 exceed \$800,000/ \$100,000, or imprisonment for not more than 5 two years, or both; PROVIDED that if in the commission of any 6 7 such offense the person uses a dangerous weapon, engages in conduct that causes bodily injury to any officer authorized to 8 9 enforce the provisions of this title, or threatens any such officer with bodily injury, the offense is punishable by a fine-\(\phi\) not to 10 exceed less than \$1 million \$200,000, or imprisonment for not 11 more than ten years, or both; and PROVIDED FURTHER that where 12 a regional fisheries treaty so requires, persons arrested for 13 violating any provisions of, or regulations under, such treaty shall 14 not be subject to imprisonment. 15 Any offense described as a prohibited act by 16 17 subsection (2) of section 501 is punishable by a fine of not less than \$800,000 500,000. Each day of continuing violation shall be 18 19 considered a separate offense. (5) A violation of any provision of this title for which no 20 21 other punishment is prescribed is punishable by a fine not to 22 exceed \$10,000. 23 (6) In determining the amount of any fine and the length 24 of any imprisonment, the Court shall take into account those

factors set forth in section 502(3) of this title."
