#### AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 6, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by Public Law No. 20-154, in order to appropriate \$1,703,641 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to provide additional funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, various grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

The purpose of this act is to appropriate the sum of \$67,960,911 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources

Development. The National Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the budget for the Department of Education. 6	(b) The allottees shall be responsible for
7	ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
8	necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
9	this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
10	of the sums appropriated.
11	(2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
12	appropriated by this act are as follows:
13	(a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
14	shall be the President of the Federated States of
15	Micronesia;
16	(b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds

13	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
14	becoming law without such approval.
