

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 18-35, by amending sections 2,3,4,5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and allottee of funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-35 is hereby

8 Section 5. Section 6 of Public Law No. 18-35 is hereby  
 9 amended to read as follows:

10 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse  
 11 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
 12 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
 13 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not  
 14 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The  
 15 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
 16 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
 17 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that no  
 18 obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
 19 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated  
 20 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap  
 21 State provided that the allottee of funds appropriated  
 22 under section 2(e) shall be the President of COM-FSM.  
 23 The allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and 4  
 24 of this act shall be the President of the Federated  
 25 States of Micronesia or his designee, EXCEPT THAT the

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1 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections (3)(a),  
2 (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l),  
3 (m), (n), (o), (p), (q), (r), (s), (t), (u), (v), (w),  
4 (x) ~~and~~ (y) and (ag) of section 3 of this act shall be  
5 the Mayor of Lelu Town Government; the allottee of funds  
6 appropriated under subsections 4(3)(a), 4(3)(b) and  
7 4(3)(e) of section 4 of this act shall be the Pohnpei  
8 Transportation Authority. The allottee of funds  
9 appropriated under subsections 5(1) and 5(3) of this act  
10 shall be the Governor of Chuuk State or his designee.  
11 The allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2)  
12 of this act shall be the Mortlock Islands Development  
13 Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
14 subsection 5(4) of this act shall be the Southern  
15 Namoneas Development Authority. The allottee of funds  
16 appropriated under subsection 5(5) of this act shall be  
17 the Faichuk Development Authority. The allottee of funds  
18 appropriated under subsection 5(6) of this act shall be  
19 the General Manager of the Northwest Island Development  
20 Authority. The authority of the allottee to obligate  
21 funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on September  
22 30, 2015."

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25 Section 6. This act shall become law upon approval by the

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1 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
2 becoming law without such approval.
