

AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, to appropriate \$2,277,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Legislative Branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; and Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 22-60, 22-80 and 22-103, is hereby further
3 amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of \$79,526,238 from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2022, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact
15 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in
17 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum

1 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

2 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended

22 Section 6. Section 12 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by
 23 Public Law No. 22-103, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

24 "Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and Lapse
 25 Dates.

1 (1) General provisions.

2 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
3 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
4 accordance with applicable law, including, but not
5 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

6 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
7 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
8 necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
9 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
10 of the sums appropriated.

11 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds appropriated
12 by this act are as follows:

13 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall
14 be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

15 (b) Section 3 and section 8(12)(w) - the allottee
16 of these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of
17 the Federated States of Micronesia;

18 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall
19 be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated
20 States of Micronesia;

21 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall
22 be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
23 Micronesia;

24 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
25 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of

1 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
2 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

3 (i) Sections 8(1)(f) and 8(13)(q) – the
4 allottee of these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint
5 Committee on Compact Review and Planning;

6 (ii) Section 8(8)(a) – the allottee of these
7 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

8 (iii) Section 8(8)(b) – the allottee of these
9 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

10 (iv) Section 8(8)(c) – the allottee of these
11 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk, except
12 the for the \$75,000 for the Weno Municipal Police, whom
13 the allottee shall be the President of the Federated
14 States of Micronesia;

15 (v) Section 8(8)(d) – the allottee of these
16 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

17 (vi) Section 8(11) – the allottee of these
18 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
19 Federated States of Micronesia;

20 (vii) Section 8(12)(a) – the allottee of these
21 funds shall be the President of the College of Micronesia-
22 FSM;

23 (viii) Section 8(12)(d) through (g) – the
24 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the
25 respective State Supreme Court;

1 (ix) Section 8(12)(h) - the allottee of these
2 funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
3 the Federated States of Micronesia;

4 (x) Section 9(1) - the allottee of these
5 funds shall be the President of the College of Micronesia-
6 FSM;

7 (xi) Section 9(3)(b) - the allottee of these
8 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

9 (xii) Section 9(3)(b) - the allottee of these
10 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

11 (xiv) Section 9(3)(c) - the allottee of these
12 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

13 (xv) Section 9(3)(d) - the allottee of these
14 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

15 (xvi) Section 9(3)(e) - the allottee of these
16 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

17 (xvii) Section 9(11)(b) - the allottee of
18 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
19 Federated States of Micronesia; and

20 (xviii) (Section 9(11)(d) - the allottee of
21 these funds shall be the President of the Constitutional
22 Convention;

23 (xix) Section 9(8)(o) - the allottee of these
24 funds shall be the Secretary of the Department of Health.

1 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
2 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of
3 September 30, 2022; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
4 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not lapse.”

5 Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
6 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
7 becoming law without such approval.
