A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 11-23, by amending sections 2, 8 and 13 to appropriate the sum of \$1,627,425.18 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, as supplemental funding for the Executive Branch and the College of Micronesia-FSM, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 11-23 is hereby amended 1 to read as follows: ' 2 3 "Section 2. Operating expenses of the Executive Branch. The sum of [\$14,790,784] \$15,791,609.18, or so much 4 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from 5 the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia 6 7 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000, for the operations of the Executive Branch of the National 8 Government during fiscal year 2000. The sum appropriated 9 by this section shall be apportioned as follows: 10 (1) Office of the President 11 [\$660,229] \$961,489 for the outputs set forth on page A-12 1-3 of the budget book. 13 (2) Department of Foreign Affairs 14 (a) [\$3,633,258] \$3,816,818 for the outputs set 15 forth in pages A-2-3 through A-2-4 of the budget book and 16 for the following additional outputs: 17 (i) providing efficient and responsive 18 consular services to FSM citizens and non citizens; and 19 (ii) providing administrative and other 20 support to the Joint Committee on Compact Economic 21 Negotiations (JCN). 22 (b) Conditions on use of funds: Funds 23 appropriated under this subsection for JCN travel and 24 representation expenses shall not be available for 25

17	Section 3. Section 13 of Public Law No. 11-23 is hereby
18	amended to read as follows:
19	"Section 13. <u>College of Micronesia-FSM</u> .
20	The sum of $\{[3,500,000], 3,993,600\}$, or so much thereof as
21	may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General
22	Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
23	year ending September 30, 2000, for operations and
24	maintenance costs of the College and for student
25	assistance. Of the total funds appropriated under this

1	section, \$800,000 shall be deemed to come from funds
2	available under section 216(a)(3) of the Compact of Free
3	Association. The sum appropriated by this section shall
4	be apportioned as follows:
5	(1) Operations and maintenance of
6	the College of Micronesia-FSM\$ 3,200,000
7	(2) Student assistance, PROVIDED that
8	these funds shall be used strictly for direct
9	financial assistance to COM-FSM students, for
10	the purpose of helping them meet their tuition
11	and housing obligations, and PROVIDED FURTHER
12	that these funds may be used only to supplement
13	some payment that must be made by the students
14	and their parents, and PROVIDED FURTHER that the
15	co-payment by the student or the student's parent
16	must be proportionally the same for each in
17	relation to their total obligation, and PROVIDED
18	FURTHER that only students with a passing grade
19	point average will be eligible to receive these
20	funds
21	(3) Architectural drawings and associated
22	costs for construction of infrastructural
23	<u>facilities</u> 493,600
