A RESOLUTION

Endorsing "The Rarotonga Agreement: Towards Healthy Islands, December 1997."

- 1 WHEREAS, the Federated States of Micronesia is one of the 191
- 2 member countries of the World Health Organization (WHO) and one of
- 3 the 16 member countries of the WHO Western Pacific Region; and
- 4 WHEREAS, as one of its global objectives, WHO strives to attain
- 5 the highest possible level of health for all people it serves; and
- 6 WHEREAS, in 1978, WHO member countries met in Alma Ata, Russia,
- 7 and declared the global initiative to attain "HEALTH FOR ALL BY YEAR
- 8 2000"; and
- 9 WHEREAS, since 1978, WHO has focused on a specific global
- 10 health issue each year and monitored the health status of all its
- 11 member countries every five years and realized that the Pacific
- 12 Island Countries are unique with unique health problems, and
- 13 concluded that there should be a health monitoring scheme that is
- 14 specific to the Pacific Island Countries; and
- WHEREAS, in March 1995, a meeting of the Ministers of Health of
- 16 the Pacific Islands was convened at Yanuca Island, Fiji, in response
- 17 to the rapidly changing social and economic conditions in Pacific
- 18 Island Countries and the effect of these changes on the quality of
- 19 life and health status; and
- WHEREAS, at the Yanuca Island meeting, a consensus was reached
- 21 on a course of action to place the health and well-being of Pacific
- 22 Islanders at the center of National Development Plans; and
- WHEREAS, building on the positive experience from 1995-1997 in
- 24 implementing the Yanuca Island Declaration, the Ministers of Health
- 25 of the Pacific Islands met in Rarotonga, Cook Islands on August 6

- 1 and 7, 1997, and there:
- 2 (1) reaffirmed the importance of partnerships among
- 3 communities, government departments and other sectors in resolving
- 4 priority health issues;
- 5 (2) agreed to convene and facilitate national and local
- 6 meetings to develop national Healthy Islands Plans of Action and
- 7 associated coordination mechanisms, to promote application of the
- 8 Healthy Islands approach, and to strengthen efforts to attain health
- 9 and well-being for people living in rural and remote areas;
- 10 (3) agreed to strengthen the capacity for training and
- 11 educating health workers in Pacific Island Countries through the
- 12 development of a network of local training institutions and through
- 13 intensifying cooperation among existing training institutions;
- 14 (4) agreed to work to overcome obstacles to the bulk
- 15 purchasing of pharmaceutical and other health supplies and address
- 16 related issues through agreements between interested countries in
- 17 the Pacific; and
- 18 (5) determined to extend training in the practice of
- 19 traditional medicine; and
- WHEREAS, the Rarotonga Agreement is a useful guide to health
- 21 promotion in villages, towns, homes, workplaces, markets, schools,
- 22 and islands and has been developed into a Pacific regional
- 23 initiative; and
- 24 WHEREAS, promotion of health and wellness from birth to old age
- 25 is achievable through the development of health-for-all campaigns;

1 and 2 WHEREAS, the Federated States of Micronesia is involved with other helpful WHO initiatives, due to ease of implementation into 4 the Federated States of Micronesia's political and social 5 environment; and WHEREAS, the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia 6 7 supports each of the measures inherent in the Rarotonga Agreement 8 that can be used to encourage and enhance what people can do 9 themselves, in conjunction with their families, communities and 10 nation, to improve and manage their own health, and believes that 11 Healthy Islands should be the places where: 12 (a) children are nurtured in body and mind; 13 (b) environments invite learning and leisure; (c) people work and age with dignity; and 14 15 (d) ecological balance is a source of pride; 16 now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eleventh Congress of the Federated States 17 18 of Micronesia, First Special Session, 1999, that the Congress hereby endorses the Rarotonga Agreement: Towards Healthy Islands; and 19 20 21 22 23 24
