Your Committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred Congressional Bill No. 22-240, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE \$69,439,042 FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2023, TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE OPERATIONS OF ALL BRANCHES OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, ITS AGENCIES, VARIOUS PROGRAMS, GRANTS, SUBSIDIES, AND CONSTRIBUTIONS AND CAPITAL AND HUMAN RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.",

begs leave to report as follows.

The intent and purpose of the bill are expressed in its title.

The subject bill is based upon the National Government Fiscal Year 2023 Recommended Budget ("Budget Book"), transmitted by the Executive in Presidential Communication No. 22-228, as reported on by each Congress Standing Committee and one Special Committee.

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Your Standing and Special Committees have recommended funding levels for budget requests within their areas of jurisdiction. Congress has adopted each of the Committee's reports. The report numbers are as follows: Climate Change and Environmental Issues — Special Committee Report No. 22-45; Education — S.C.R. No. 22-35; Health and Social Affairs — S.C.R. No. 22-37; Ways and Means — S.C.R. No. 22-39; Transportation and Communication — S.C.R. No. 22-47; Resources and Development — S.C.R. No. 22-48; Judiciary and Governmental Operations — S.C.R. No. 22-49; and External Affairs — S.C.R. No. 22-50.

FY 2023 REVENUE PROJECTIONS

Your Committee notes that FY 2023 Estimated Revenues were included with the Budget Book, with projections of \$83,189,854 of Domestic Revenue, \$1,000,000 of Amended Compact Sector Grant funding, and \$1,612,592 of Supplemental Education Grant (SEG) funding for FY 2023. The Estimated Revenues also included U.S. Federal Programs and other foreign assistance in the amount of \$7,555,744, which Congress does not appropriate; as such, your Committee has disregarded these sources from Estimated Revenues and appropriating legislation.

Adding the Domestic Revenue, the Amended Compact Sector Grant Funding for COM-FSM, and the SEG, a total of \$85,802,446 in revenue is estimated for FY 2023. This total includes \$12,000,000 which shall be deducted from the projected fishing fee revenue of \$60,000,000, as 20% of the fishing fees goes into the FSM Trust Fund and \$3,000,000 which shall also be deducted from the projected corporate income fee revenue of \$6,000,000, as 50% of the Corporate Tax goes into the FSM Trust Fund. After deducting the aforementioned amounts, \$68,189,854 will be available from Domestic Revenue, \$1,000,000 will be available from Amended Compact Sector funds, and \$1,612,592 will be available from the Supplemental Education Grant.

All your Committees worked diligently to bring the budget into balance while meeting the needs of the National Government, agencies, and programs, as well as provide the Grants, Subsidies, and

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Contributions and Capital and Human Resources on which many organizations rely. In this report, your Committee on Ways and Means recommends approval of a budget for FY 2023 totaling \$69,414,042; of this amount \$66,801,450 is recommended from Domestic Revenue, \$1,000,000 is recommended from the Amended Compact Sector for COMFSM, and \$1,612,592 is recommended from the Supplemental Education Grant.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORT ADJUSTMENTS

Your Committee has reviewed the Standing Committee Reports and the Special Committee Report of each of your Committees. Each report made recommendations in relation to the budgets of the departments, agencies, offices and programs within each Committee's jurisdiction. Your Committee's deliberations and recommendations are summarized by this report and reflected in the attached bill. Your Committee notes that many of the adjustments are temporary to balance the budget, and may be reinstated upon receipt of new revenue projections.

After reviewing each report, your Committee wishes to make the following adjustments:

(1) Climate Change and Environmental Issues — Special Committee Report No. 22-45

Your Committee notes the Office of the Secretary travel budget on page 5 of S.C.R. No. 22-45 should be reduced by \$100,000 to \$17,263, as the \$100,000 is appropriated instead under Section 8 for COP 27 Travel and this is a duplicate amount. The total recommended operational budget for the Department of Environment, Climate Change, and Emergency Management (DECCEM) is as follows: \$586,899 for personnel; \$66,435 for travel; \$131,500 for contractual services; \$52,228 for OCE; and \$33,000 for fixed assets; for a total of \$870,052.

Your Committee also recommends reducing the appropriation for Digital Atlas Development for the Four States and Outer Islands under Capital

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and Human Resources Development from \$225,000 to \$-0-; Your Committee understands there are funds available from FY 2022 for this purpose that have not been spent.

(2) Education - S.C.R. No. 22-35

Your Committee notes that the SEG amount requested in the Budget Book and approved in the Committee Report was in excess of the revenue projections by \$9,997. As such, your Committee recommends reducing the amount of contractual services from \$111,157 to \$101,160 under the Department of Education - Division of Quality and Effectiveness, until the SEG grant award is received, which reduces the total of contractual services for the Department of Education to \$221,229.

(3) Transportation and Communication - S.C.R. No. 22-47

Under Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions, your Committee recommends reducing the CIA Fuel Subsidy from \$200,000 to \$-0-.

Under Capital and Human Resources Development, your Committee recommends reducing the amount for Operation and Dry-Docking of Caroline Voyager and Navigator from \$1,000,000 to \$-0-, as the funds are not needed until later in the fiscal year. Additionally, your Committee recommends reducing the funding for National Government Facility Improvements and Renovations from \$592,715 to the EBRC recommended amount of \$115,685.

(4) Resources and Development - S.C.R. No. 22-48

Your Committee recommends reducing the funding for Domestic Tourism from \$250,000 to \$-0-. Your Committee also recommends removing the funding of \$30,000 for a Fisheries Economist/Consultant as it is a duplicate request that is funded elsewhere in the budget.

Your Committee notes that the allottees of the funding for the Chambers of Commerce and Conservation Societies will be the respective state governors.

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(5) Judiciary and Governmental Operations - S.C.R. No. 22-49;

Your Committee notes that nine new vehicles are requested for the National Police — Investigation and Protection Services, with three vehicles each for Kosrae, Chuuk, and Yap. Your Committee recommends reducing the recommended amount by \$75,000 to fund five vehicles instead: one for Kosrae, one for Yap, and three for Chuuk.

Under Grants, Subsidies and Contributions, your Committee recommends appropriating a fuel subsidy of \$10,000 each for fuel for the Police in Kosrae and Yap. Your Committee understands these departments often struggle to receive funding for their fuel needs.

Under Capital and Human Resources Development, your Committee recommends reducing the funding for Cyber Security acquisition of Intelligence Infrastructure and Hardware from \$300,000 to \$-0-, and reducing the funding for COVID-19 Law Enforcement and Emergency Response recommended by the Committee from \$500,000 to \$-0-.

CONCLUSION

Your Committee on Ways and Means, with the aforementioned adjustments to the respective Standing Committee Reports, is in accord with the intent and purpose of C.B. No. 22-240 and recommends its passage on First Reading, and that it be placed on the Calendar for Second and Final reading in the form attached hereto.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate \$69,439,042 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2023, to provide funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
