

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 22-86, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-101, 22-102, 22-106, 22-140, 22-147, 22-168, 22-185, 22-197, 23-06, 23-12, 23-39, 23-50, 23-64, 23-114, 23-135 and 24-04, by amending sections 3, 4, 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and allottee of funds previously appropriated therein, for the purpose of funding priority infrastructure projects and other public projects and social programs for the people of Pohnpei, Kosrae and Chuuk States, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

17 Section 4. Section 6 of Public Law No. 22-86, as amended by
18 Public Laws Nos. 22-102, 22-140, 22-168, 23-12, 23-39 and 23-64, is
19 hereby further amended to read as follows:

20 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
21 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
22 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
23 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not
24 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The
25 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these

1 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
2 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that
3 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
4 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated
5 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap
6 State or his designee. The allottee of funds
7 appropriated under subsection 3(1) of this act shall be
8 the Governor of the State of Kosrae or his designee;
9 EXCEPT THAT the allottee of funds appropriated under
10 section 3(1)(q) of this act shall be the Mayor of Malem
11 Municipal Government or his designee; the allottee of
12 funds appropriated under subsection 3(2) of this act
13 shall be the Mayor of Lelu Town Government or his
14 designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under
15 section 4 of this act shall be the President of the
16 Federated States of Micronesia or his designee; PROVIDED
17 THAT, the allottee of funds appropriated under
18 subsection 4(1)(c) of this act shall be the FSM
19 Telecommunication Corporation; the allottee of funds
20 appropriated under subsection 4(1)(g) of this act shall
21 be the Pohnpei Utility Corporation (PUC); the allottee
22 of funds appropriated under subsections 4(1)(a),
23 4(2)(a), 4(2)(b), 4(2)(c), 4(2)(e), 4(2)(f), 4(2)(h),
24 4(2)(i), 4(2)(j), 4(2)(l), 4(3)(b), 4(3)(c), 4(3)(d),
25 4(3)(e) 4(3)(f), 4(3)(q), 4(3)(r) and 4(3)(ac) of this

1 act shall be the Pohnpei Transportation Authority (PTA);
2 the allottee of funds appropriated under subsections
3 4(1)(j), 4(2)(d) and 4(3)(l) of this act shall be the
4 Secretary of the Department of Resources and Development
5 or her designee; the allottee of the funds appropriated
6 under subsections 4(1)(b), 4(1)(d), 4(1)(e), 4(1)(f),
7 4(1)(h), 4(1)(k), 4(1)(l), 4(1)(m), 4(1)(n), 4(2)(g),
8 4(3)(a), 4(3)(g), 4(3)(h), 4(3)(j) 4(3)(k), 4(3)(p),
9 4(3)(s) , 4(3)(u), 4(3)(z), 4(3)(aa) and 4(3)(ab), of
10 this act shall be the Secretary of the Department of
11 Transportation, Communications and Infrastructure or his
12 designee; the allottee of funds appropriated under
13 subsection 4(2)(k) of this act shall be the President of
14 the COM-FSM or his designee; the allottee of funds
15 appropriated under subsections 4(1)(i) 4(3)(o) and
16 4(3)(i) of this act shall be the Secretary of the
17 Department of Health and Social Affairs or her designee;
18 the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection
19 4(3)(m) of this act shall be the Vice President of the
20 Federated States of Micronesia or his designee; the
21 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections
22 4(3)(n), 4(3)(v), 4(3)(w), 4(3)(x), of this act shall be
23 the Meninkeder Lapalap of Madolenihmw. The allottee of
24 funds appropriated under subsection 4(3)(y) of this act
25 shall be the Luhkenmenlap of Kittu. The allottee of

1 funds appropriated under subsection 4(3)(t) of this act
2 shall be the Pohnpei Utility Corporation (PUC). The
3 allottee of the funds appropriated under subsections
4 5(1), 5(2) and 5(7) of this act shall be the Governor of
5 Chuuk State or his designee; EXCEPT THAT the allottee of
6 funds appropriated under subsections 5(1)(a), 5(1)(b)
7 and 5(1)(o) of this act shall be the Mayor of Weno
8 Municipal Government or his designee; the allottee of
9 funds appropriated under subsection 5(1)(i) of this act
10 shall be the Saramen Chuuk Academy School; the allottee
11 of the funds appropriated under subsection 5(3) of this
12 act shall be the Mortlocks Island Development Authority
13 (MIDA); the allottee of funds appropriated under
14 subsection 5(4) of this act shall be the Mayor of Weno
15 Municipal Government or his designee; the allottee of
16 the funds appropriated under subsection 5(5) of this act
17 shall be the Southern Namoneas Development Authority;
18 the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection
19 5(6) of this act shall be the Faichuk Development
20 Authority. The authority of the allottee to obligate
21 funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on September
22 30, 2026.”

1 Section 5. This act shall become law upon approval by the
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
3 law without such approval.
