
A RESOLUTION

Expressing support for, and endorsement of, a possible membership of the Federated States of Micronesia in the International Labor Organization.

1 WHEREAS, the International Labor Organization (ILO) is a
2 United Nations agency founded in 1919 whose mandate is to advance
3 social and economic justice by setting international labor
4 standards; and

5 WHEREAS, the Federated States of Micronesia has been invited
6 to consider joining the ILO, which invitation had been coursed
7 through various recommendations, through the Universal Periodic
8 Review (URP) and also through the Human Rights Council review of
9 human rights treaties that the FSM is a State Party; and

10 WHEREAS, the ILO's work involves the promotion of rights of
11 workers, by setting international labor standards aimed at
12 ensuring basic rights at work; and it further involves improving
13 working conditions, enhancing social dialogue among governments,
14 employers and workers, providing technical assistance to its
15 members, and fostering international cooperation; and

16 WHEREAS, the FSM stands to gain from numerous technical
17 assistance and support from the ILO and will align the FSM with
18 human rights conventions and recommendations described above; now,
19 therefore,

20 BE IT RESOLVED by the Twenty-Fourth Congress of the Federated

1 States of Micronesia, First Special Session, 2025, that Congress
2 hereby supports for the Federated States of Micronesia to join the
3 International Labor Organization; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
5 resolution be transmitted to the President of the Federated
6 States of Micronesia.
