A RESOLUTION

Honoring the life and legacy, and expressing the sincere condolences and sadness of the Twenty-Fourth Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia to the family of the late Joseph J. Urusemal, the Sixth President of the Federated States of Micronesia, at his passing on September 16, 2025.

- 1 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal was born on
- 2 March 19, 1952, on Woleai in Yap State and devoted his life to the
- 3 service of his community and the State of Yap, and to the
- 4 development of this Nation and the welfare of all of our citizens;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal upon finishing
- 7 his primary school education attended Xavier High School, which he
- 8 admired and supported during his life because of its high ideals
- 9 and standards, after graduating in 1973 he pursued higher
- 10 education in the United States where he attended Rockhurst College
- 11 in Kansas City, Missouri and received a Bachelor of Arts Degree in
- 12 the Administration of Justice in 1976, he then remained in
- 13 Missouri where he worked for the Jackson County Department of
- 14 Corrections for six years when he decided to return to the
- 15 Federated States of Micronesia to serve our citizens; and
- 16 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal returned to
- 17 the Federated States of Micronesia to serve our people in 1982
- 18 first returning to the State of Yap where he became a teacher and
- 19 counselor at the Outer Islands High School, as a new professional

- 1 the late President Joseph J. Urusemal took every opportunity to
- 2 advise and assist students, and to instill the ideals of service,
- 3 integrity and the value of education, he availed himself of all
- 4 opportunities to further improve the education system including
- 5 serving on the Yap State Education Steering Committee where he was
- 6 instrumental in the establishment of the Yap State Education Five
- 7 Year Plan; and
- 8 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal in 1987 ran
- 9 for Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia and was elected
- 10 as the State of Yap at-large four-year Member beginning his
- 11 immensely distinguished service of over 38 years with the Fifth
- 12 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia, throughout his
- 13 career he took a keen interest in development, health and
- 14 education issues, and he participated actively in all committees
- 15 where he was a member, as well as, maintaining an open door policy
- 16 encouraging the public to visit with him as he considered himself
- 17 a servant of all the citizens of this Nation; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal became the
- 19 Floor Leader of the Seventh Congress of the Federated States of
- 20 Micronesia in 1991 and was maintained in that position until 2003,
- 21 as Floor Leader his attention to detail and correct procedure
- 22 greatly enhanced the leadership of Congress, the late President
- 23 Joseph J. Urusemal's discipline extended to all his work,
- 24 especially when reviewing budget matters, infrastructure projects
- 25 and social welfare projects, his work ethic, now legend, as he

- 1 often continued working long after normal business hours, being
- 2 satisfied only when he clearly understood the matters before him;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal was recognized
- 5 by the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia in 2003 for
- 6 his competence and integrity and was elected by its members as the
- 7 Sixth President of the Federated States of Micronesia on May 11,
- 8 2003, during his presidency he was known for his inclusiveness
- 9 including appointing the women to cabinet positions, he oversaw
- 10 the implementation of the Amended Compact of Free Association, and
- 11 the realization of large infrastructure and development projects;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal returned to
- 14 the Fifteenth Congress of Federated States of Micronesia after his
- 15 service as our Nation's president, he then was selected as the
- 16 Chairman of the then Committee on Health, Education and Social
- 17 Affairs, and continued his service subsequently as Chairman of the
- 18 stand-alone Committee on Education, he believed that the young
- 19 people of our Nation are its greatest resource and nothing was
- 20 more important, as an elder statesman he gave tirelessly as a
- 21 mentor and advisor, and continued working until the last days of
- 22 his life to serve the Nation and its citizens he so loved; and
- 23 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal valued the
- 24 culture and traditions of his home State of Yap, he was a deeply
- 25 religious man finding support for his high moral standards and

- discipline in the church, he was devoted to his family, and was also known for his humor, love of sports and his humility; and 2 3 WHEREAS, the late President Joseph J. Urusemal will be mourned by his friends and former colleagues, and the citizens of our Nation as a man who imbodied all that is great and good, and 5 at this time our hearts especially go out with sincere condolences to his wife Olania Latileilam, and his children Robert J. Marolfal, Tarsis Raffilug, Craig Erhienig, Spencer Osomai, Elenita 9 Laenirhlur and Rhonda Lauwelig and his large extended family; and 10 WHEREAS, the Twenty-Fourth Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia recognizes the extraordinary service and dedication 11 12 that the late President Joseph J. Urusemal gave through his long 13 career to the State of Yap, and the Nation as a whole, it wishes 14 to express its sincere condolences to his family, former 15 colleagues and the State of Yap and all the citizens of our Nation 16 at his passing; now, therefore, 17 BE IT RESOLVED by the Twenty-Fourth Congress of the Federated
- 18 States of Micronesia, Second Regular Session, 2025, that the
- 19 Congress hereby honors the life and legacy, and expresses its
- 20 sincere condolences and sadness to the family, friends and
- 21 colleagues of the late President Joseph J. Urusemal at his passing
- 22 on September 16, 2025; and
