
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 24-39 to appropriate [~~\$3,689,737~~] 4,127,434 in supplemental funding from the General Fund for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; Capital and Human Resource Development; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as
4 follows: To appropriate the sum of \$[~~130,536,291~~]

6 of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,

9 National Public Auditor; the operations of Agencies,

11 Government; Special Programs; Grants, Subsidies, and
12 Contributions; Capital and Human Resource Development;
13 Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant Projects and Offices;
14 and Compact IMF Grant Distributions. Of the total amount
15 of funds appropriated herein, \$[~~6,119,994~~] 7,119,994 shall
16 be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector Grant;
17 \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact Health
18 Sector Grant; \$[~~482,543~~] 765,248 shall be deemed to come

1 from Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall be
2 deemed to come from Compact Private Sector Development
3 Sector Grant; \$[~~1,565,948~~] 2,565,948 shall be deemed to
4 come from Compact Public Sector Capacity Building Sector
5 Grant; \$280,000 shall be deemed to come from Compact
6 Enhanced Reporting and Accountability Sector Grant;
7 \$[~~34,999,990~~] 35,000,000 shall be deemed to come from
8 Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant to be distributed to
9 the National and State governments pursuant to the grant
10 terms; and \$10,220,000 shall be deemed to come from
11 Compact IMF Grant to be deposited into the National and
12 State IMF sub-accounts pursuant to the grant terms. The
