
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 3, 8, 9, and 14 of Public Law No. 24-39, to appropriate \$2,607,715 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the Operating Expenses of the Legislative Branch; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resource Development; to change the allottee of certain previously appropriated funds; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 “Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as
4 follows: To appropriate the sum of [~~\$130,536,291~~]
5 \$133,144,006 from the General Fund of the Federated
6 States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September
7 30, 2026, for the purpose of funding the operations of
8 all branches of the National Government; the operations
9 of the National Public Auditor; the operations of
10 Agencies, Boards, Authorities, and Commissions of the
11 National Government; Special Programs; Grants, Subsidies,
12 and Contributions; Capital and Human Resource
13 Development; Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant Projects
14 and Offices; and Compact IMF Grant Distributions. Of the
15 total amount of funds appropriated herein, [~~\$6,119,994~~]
16 \$7,119,994 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education
17 Sector Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from

1 Compact Health Sector Grant; [~~\$482,543~~] \$765,248 shall be
2 deemed to come from Compact Environment Sector Grant;
3 \$619,030 shall be deemed to come from Compact Private
4 Sector Development Sector Grant; [~~\$1,565,948~~] \$2,565,948
5 shall be deemed to come from Compact Public Sector
6 Capacity Building Sector Grant; \$280,000 shall be deemed
7 to come from Compact Enhanced Reporting and
8 Accountability Sector Grant; [~~\$34,999,990~~] \$35,000,000
9 shall be deemed to come from Compact Infrastructure
10 Sector Grant to be distributed to the National and State
11 governments pursuant to the grant terms; and \$10,220,000
12 shall be deemed to come from Compact IMF Grant to be
13 deposited into the National and State IMF sub-accounts
14 pursuant to the grant terms. The sum appropriated herein
15 shall be apportioned as follows:"

16 Section 2. Section 3 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby
17 amended to read as follows:

18 "Section 3. Operating Expenses of the Legislative
19 Branch. The sum of [~~\$9,154,258~~] \$9,397,258, or so much
20 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from
21 the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia
22 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, for the
23 purpose of funding the operations of the Legislative
24 Branch of the National Government during fiscal year

2026. The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

(3) Congress Delegation Offices.

The sum of \$892,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the operations of the Congress Delegation Offices during the fiscal year 2026. Of the amounts appropriated for Contractual Services for each Delegation Office, up to a maximum of \$50,000 per Member, at the Delegation Office's discretion, may be used for representation expenses, including prior years' reimbursable expenses and other obligations. Any unexpended representation funds shall lapse into the FSM Trust Fund state sub-account of the respective state or states. The sum appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:

 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "Section 14. Allotment and Management of Funds and Lapse
 16 Dates.

17 (1) General Provisions.

18 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
 19 allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for
 20 in accordance with applicable law, including, but
 21 not limited to, the Financial Management Act of
 22 1979, as amended.

23 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
 24 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may

1 be necessary, are used solely for the purposes
2 specified in this act, and that no obligations are
3 incurred in excess of the sums appropriated.

4 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds appropriated
5 by this act are as follows:

6 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
7 shall be the President of the Federated States of
8 Micronesia;

9 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds
10 shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
11 Federated States of Micronesia;

12 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds
13 shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of
14 the Federated States of Micronesia;

15 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds
16 shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States
17 of Micronesia;

18 (e) Sections 6 through 11 - the allottee of
19 these funds shall be the President of the Federated
20 States of Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for
21 the following subsections of sections 8 through 11
22 of this act:

23 (i) Section 8(8)(a) - the allottee of
24 these funds shall be the Governor of the State

1 of Kosrae;

2 (ii) Section 8(8)(b) - the allottee of
3 these funds shall be the Governor of the State
4 of Pohnpei;

5 (iii) Section 8(8)(c) - the allottee of
6 these funds shall be the Governor of the State
7 of Chuuk;

8 (iv) Section 8(8)(d) - the of these funds
9 allottee shall be the Governor of the State of
10 Yap;

11 (v) Section 8(11) - the allottee of these
12 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of
13 the Federated States of Micronesia;

14 (vi) Section 8(12)(a) - the allottee of
15 these funds shall be the President of the
16 College of Micronesia-FSM;

17 (vii) Section 8(12)(e) through (h) - the
18 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief
19 Justice of the respective State Supreme Courts;

20 (viii) Section 8(12)(i) - the allottee of
21 these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the
22 Supreme Court of the Federated States of
23 Micronesia;

11 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
12 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of

15 11 of this act shall not lapse."

16 Section 6. This act shall become law upon approval by the
17 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
18 becoming law without such approval.
