## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 3, 8, 9, and 14 of Public Law No. 24-39, to appropriate \$2,607,715 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the Operating Expenses of the Legislative Branch; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resource Development; to change the allotee of certain previously appropriated funds; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
