
A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 6, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by Public Law No. 24-46, to appropriate \$4,133,047 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch, Agencies, Board and Commission of the National Government; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resource Development; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by
2 Public Law No. 24-46, is hereby further amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as
5 follows: To appropriate the sum of \$[~~133,564,006~~
6 137,697,053 from the General Fund of the Federated
7 States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
8 September 30, 2026, for the purpose of funding the
9 operations of all branches of the National Government;
10 the operations of the National Public Auditor; the
11 operations of Agencies, Boards, Authorities, and
12 Commissions of the National Government; Special
13 Programs; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions;
14 Capital and Human Resource Development; Compact
15 Infrastructure Sector Grant Projects and Offices; and
16 Compact IMF Grant Distributions. Of the total amount
17 of funds appropriated herein, \$7,119,994 shall be

1 deemed to come from Compact Education Sector Grant;
2 \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact Health
3 Sector Grant; \$765,248 shall be deemed to come from
4 Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall be
5 deemed to come from Compact Private Sector Development
6 Sector Grant; \$2,565,948 shall be deemed to come from
7 Compact Public Sector Capacity Building Sector Grant;
8 \$280,000 shall be deemed to come from Compact Enhanced
9 Reporting and Accountability Sector Grant; \$35,000,000
10 shall be deemed to come from Compact Infrastructure
11 Sector Grant to be distributed to the National and
12 State governments pursuant to the grant terms; and
13 \$10,220,000 shall be deemed to come from Compact IMF
14 Grant to be deposited into the National and State IMF
15 sub-accounts pursuant to the grant terms. The sum
16 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

Of the total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$555,411 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact Health Sector Grant; \$422,543 shall be deemed to come from Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall be deemed to come from Compact Private Sector Development Sector Grant; and \$280,000 shall be deemed to come from Compact Enhanced Reporting and Accountability Sector Grant.
