PUBLIC LAW NO. 24-46

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 14 of Public Law No. 24-39, to appropriate \$3,027,715 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch and the Legislative Branch; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resource Development; to change the allottee of certain funds previously appropriated; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as
4 follows: To appropriate the sum of \$133,564,006 from
5 the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia
6 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, for the
7 purpose of funding the operations of all branches of
8 the National Government; the operations of the
9 National Public Auditor; the operations of Agencies,
10 Boards, Authorities, and Commissions of the National
11 Government; Special Programs; Grants, Subsidies, and
12 Contributions; Capital and Human Resource Development;
13 Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant Projects and
14 Offices; and Compact IMF Grant Distributions. Of the
15 total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$7,119,994
16 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector

1 Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact
2 Health Sector Grant; \$765,248 shall be deemed to come
3 from Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall
4 be deemed to come from Compact Private Sector
5 Development Sector Grant; \$2,565,948 shall be deemed
6 to come from Compact Public Sector Capacity Building
7 Sector Grant; \$280,000 shall be deemed to come from
8 Compact Enhanced Reporting and Accountability Sector
9 Grant; \$35,000,000 shall be deemed to come from
10 Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant to be distributed
11 to the National and State governments pursuant to the
12 grant terms; and \$10,220,000 shall be deemed to come
13 from Compact IMF Grant to be deposited into the
14 National and State IMF sub-accounts pursuant to the
15 grant terms. The sum appropriated herein shall be
16 apportioned as follows:"

17 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby
18 amended to read as follows:

19 "Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive
20 Branch. The sum of \$37,259,275, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
22 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for

1 year 2026. Of the total amount of funds appropriated
2 herein, \$555,411 shall be deemed to come from Compact
3 Education Sector Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to
4 come from Compact Health Sector Grant; \$422,543 shall
5 be deemed to come from Compact Environment Sector
6 Grant; \$619,030 shall be deemed to come from Compact
7 Private Sector Development Sector Grant; and \$280,000
8 shall be deemed to come from Compact Enhanced
9 Reporting and Accountability Sector Grant. The sum
10 appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as

5 Section 6. Section 14 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "Section 14. Allotment and Management of Funds and
8 Lapse Dates.

9 (1) General Provisions.

10 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
11 allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in
12 accordance with applicable law, including, but not
13 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979, as
14 amended.

15 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
16 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may
17 be necessary, are used solely for the purposes
18 specified in this act, and that no obligations are
19 incurred in excess of the sums appropriated.

20 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
21 appropriated by this act are as follows:

22 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
23 shall be the President of the Federated States of
24 Micronesia;

25 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds

1 shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
2 States of Micronesia;

3 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds
4 shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
5 Federated States of Micronesia;

6 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds
7 shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
8 Micronesia;

9 (e) Sections 6 through 11 - the allottee of
10 these funds shall be the President of the Federated
11 States of Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the
12 following subsections of sections 8 through 11 of this
13 act:

14 (i) Section 8(8)(a) - the allottee of these
15 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Kosrae;

16 (ii) Section 8(8)(b) - the allottee of these
17 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Pohnpei;

18 (iii) Section 8(8)(c) - the allottee of these
19 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;

20 (iv) Section 8(8)(d) - the of these funds
21 allottee shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;

22 (v) Section 8(11) - the allottee of these
23 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
24 Federated States of Micronesia;

25 (vi) Section 8(12)(a) - the allottee of

1 these funds shall be the President of the College of
2 Micronesia-FSM;

3 (vii) Section 8(12)(e) through (h) - the
4 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of
5 the respective State Supreme Courts;

6 (viii) Section 8(12)(i) - the allottee of
7 these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme
8 Court of the Federated States of Micronesia;

9 (ix) Section 9 (1) - the allottee of these
10 funds shall be the President of the College of
11 Micronesia-FSM;

12 (x) Section 9(11)(f) - the allottee of
13 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of
14 the Federated States of Micronesia;

15 (xi) Section 9(11)(h) - the allottee of
16 these funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;
17 and

18 (xii) Section 10 - the allottee of these
19 funds shall be the Secretary of the Department of
20 Transportation, Communications and Infrastructure.

21 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
22 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
23 of September 30, 2026; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the
24 authority to obligate funds appropriated under
25 sections 9, 10, and 11 of this act shall not lapse."

1 Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
3 becoming law without such approval.
