AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 23-121, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 23-129, 23-144, and 24-01, to appropriate \$1,742,179 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, to provide funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; operations of the Legislative Branch; operations of Agencies, Boards, Authorities, and Commissions; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resource Development; to change the use of funds for a certain line item; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1       Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 23-121, as amended by  
2 Public Laws Nos. 23-129, 23-144, and 24-01, is hereby further  
3 amended to read as follows:

4           "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as  
5           follows: To appropriate the sum of \$149,284,651 from the  
6           General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for  
7           the fiscal year ending September 30, 2025, for the  
8           purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the

10           Micronesia; National Public Auditor; Agencies, Boards,  
11           Authorities and Commissions of the National Government;  
12           Special Programs; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions;  
13           and Capital and Human Resources Development. Of the  
14           total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$7,618,319  
15           shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector  
16           Grant; \$881,148 shall be deemed to come from Compact

1 Health Sector Grant; \$1,014,456 shall be deemed to come  
2 from Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall be  
3 deemed to come from Compact Private Sector Development  
4 Sector Grant; \$1,565,948 shall be deemed to come from  
5 Compact Public Sector Capacity Building Sector Grant;  
6 \$303,470 shall be deemed to come from Compact Enhanced
