Dear Speaker Moses:

I wish to transmit the following Act, which I have signed to become Public Law No. 24-55:

Congressional Act No. 24-66: entitled: "TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 9, 10, AND 14 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 24-39. AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAW NO. 24-46, TO APPROPRIATE \$4,949,800 IN SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2026, TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH; OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH; CAPITAL AND HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT; AND COMPACT INFRASTRUCTURE SECTOR GRANT PROJECTS; TO EXPAND THE PERMISSIBLE USE OF FUNDS FOR A CERTAIN LINE ITEM; TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION FOR THE OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE OFFICE OF THE INDEPENDENT PROSECUTOR; TO SET THE ALLOTTEE OF THE FUNDS FOR THE OFFICE OF THE INDEPENDENT PROSECUTOR; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I take this opportunity to recognize the efforts of the 24<sup>th</sup> FSM Congress in the passage of the supplemental budget. I also wish to note that a few line items in the supplemental budget are equally urgent and important, and should be acted upon as soon as possible: unfortunately, they were not included in this Act.

In signing this Act, I acknowledge the intent of the supplemental budget to partially fund the Google Pacific Connect Project, consisting of \$1.9 million from FY25 appropriation and \$3.29 million from the FY24 funding sources and seeking appropriation in FY26. This is \$5.19 million in total. We will work with the OIA in amending the grant award to align with this congressional intent.

I took exception to the language in the report regarding the lack of funds to accommodate the entire supplemental budget request from the Executive, considering that there were available funds according to the revised revenue projection when the supplemental budget was transmitted for Congress's consideration. Moreover, I wish to convey our disappointment that a key priority identified by the National and State governments to improve and strengthen law enforcement capacity through a police academy did not receive approval.

With these observations, I wish to work with you on the future supplemental budget funding.

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 9, 10, and 14 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by Public Law No. 24-46, to appropriate \$4,949,800 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch; Operating Expenses of the Legislative Branch; Capital and Human Resource Development; and Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant Projects; to expand the permissible use of funds for a certain line item; to add a new subsection for the Operating Expenses of the Office of the Independent Prosecutor; to set the allottee of the funds for the Office of the Independent Prosecutor; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1       Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by  
2 Public Law No. 24-46, is hereby further amended to read as  
3 follows:

4           "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as  
5 follows: To appropriate the sum of \$138,513,806 from

15 Offices; and Compact IMF Grant Distributions. Of the

1 total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$7,119,994  
2 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector  
3 Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact  
4 Health Sector Grant; \$765,248 shall be deemed to come
