Congressional Act No. 22-98, entitled: "AN ACT TO FURTHER AMEND SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 8 AND 12 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 22-42, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 22-60 AND 22-80, TO APPROPRIATE \$1,596,377 FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2022, TO PROVIDE SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA; GRANTS, SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS AND TO CHANGE THE ALLOTTEE OF CERTAIN FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATE THEREIN; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES"

This Congressional Act is amending previous Public Laws to appropriate additional funds from the General Fund of the FSM to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the FSM Government and for other purposes. There is also a change of allottee on section 8(12)(w).

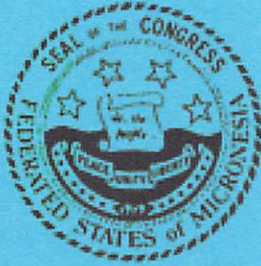

AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8 and 12 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-60 and 22-80, to appropriate \$1,596,377 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch and the Legislative Branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions and to change the allottee of certain funds previously appropriate therein; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 22-60 and 22-80, is hereby further amended to
3 read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of \$77,249,238 from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2022, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact
15 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in
17 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum

1 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

2 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by
3 Public Laws Nos. 22-60 and 22-80, is hereby further amended to
4 read as follows:

5 "Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch.

6 The sum of \$27,378,013, or so much thereof as may be
7 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund
8 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
9 year ending September 30, 2022, for the purpose of
10 funding the operations of the Executive Branch of the
11 National Government during the fiscal year 2022. The
12 sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as
13 follows:

6 further amended to read as follows:

7 "Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and
8 Lapse Dates.

9 (1) General provisions.

10 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
11 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
12 accordance with applicable law, including, but not
13 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

14 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for
15 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
16 necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
17 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
18 of the sums appropriated.

19 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
20 appropriated by this act are as follows:

21 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
22 shall be the President of the Federated States of
23 Micronesia;

1 (b) Section 3 and section 8(12)(w) - the
2 allottee of these funds shall be the Speaker of the
3 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia;

4 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds
5 shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
6 Federated States of Micronesia;

7 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds
8 shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
9 Micronesia;

10 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
11 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
12 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
13 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

14 (i) Sections 8(1)(f) and 8(13)(q) - the
15 allottee of these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint
16 Committee on Compact Review and Planning;

17 (ii) Section 8(8)(a) - the allottee of these
18 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

19 (iii) Section 8(8)(b) - the allottee of these
20 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

21 (iv) Section 8(8)(c) - the allottee of these
22 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk,
23 except the for the \$75,000 for the Weno Municipal
24 Police, whom the allottee shall be the President of the
25 Federated States of Micronesia;

1 (v) Section 8(8)(d) – the allottee of these
2 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

3 (vi) Section 8(11) – the allottee of these
4 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
5 Federated States of Micronesia;

6 (vii) Section 8(12)(a) – the allottee of
7 these funds shall be the President of the College of
8 Micronesia-FSM;

9 (viii) Section 8(12)(d) through (g) – the
10 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of
11 the respective State Supreme Court;

12 (ix) Section 8(12)(h) – the allottee of
13 these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme
14 Court of the Federated States of Micronesia;

15 (x) Section 9(1) – the allottee of these
16 funds shall be the President of the College of
17 Micronesia-FSM;

18 (xi) Section 9(3)(b) – the allottee of these
19 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

20 (xii) Section 9(3)(b) – the allottee of these
21 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

22 (xiv) Section 9(3)(c) – the allottee of these
23 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

24 (xv) Section 9(3)(d) – the allottee of these
25 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

1 (xvi) Section 9(3)(e) - the allottee of these
2 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

3 (xvii) Section 9(11)(b) - the allottee of
4 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
5 Federated States of Micronesia; and

6 (xviii) Section 9(11)(d) - the allottee of
7 these funds shall be the President of the Constitutional
8 Convention.

9 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
10 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
11 of September 30, 2022; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
12 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not
13 lapse.

14 Section 6. This act shall become law upon approval by the
15 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
16 becoming law without such approval.
