

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 9, 10, and 11, of Public Law No. 23-24, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 23-46, 23-74, and 23-119, to appropriate \$3,947,824 in domestic revenues available for appropriation due to the appropriation and subsequent reprogramming of Compact Sector Funds in Public Law No. 23-119, and to appropriate \$753,444 in Supplemental Education Grants (SEG), from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, to provide funding for the operations of the Executive and Legislative Branches; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development; to clarify the fund source of funds previously appropriated; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 23-24, as amended by  
2 Public Law Nos. 23-46, 23-74, and 23-119, is hereby further  
3 amended to read as follows:

4           "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as  
5 follows: To appropriate the sum of \$87,594,632 from the  
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for  
7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024, for the  
8 purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the  
9 National Government of the Federated States of  
10 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants,  
11 subsidies and contributions, and Capital and Human  
12 Resources Development. Of the total amount of funds  
13 appropriated herein, \$1,380,081 shall be deemed to come  
14 from Compact Education Grant; \$603,581 shall be deemed

1 to come from Compact Health Sector Grant; \$397,200 shall  
 2 be deemed to come from Compact Environment Grant;  
 3 \$540,649 shall be deemed to come from Private Sector  
 4 Development Sector Grant; \$2,575,002 shall be deemed to  
 5 come from Compact Public Sector Capacity Building Sector  
 6 Grant; \$221,935 shall be deemed to come from Compact  
 7 Enhanced Reporting and Accountability Sector Grant;  
 8 \$3,273,709 shall be deemed to come from Compact  
 9 Infrastructure Sector Grant to be distributed to the  
 10 National and State governments pursuant to the grant  
 11 terms; and \$2,366,036 shall be deemed to come from the  
 12 Supplemental Education Grant (SEG). The sum  
 13 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

14 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 23-24, as amended
