Dear Mr. Speaker:

Your Committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred  
Congressional Bill No. 24-92, entitled:

"A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 3, 8, 9, AND 14 OF  
PUBLIC LAW NO. 24-39, TO APPROPRIATE \$2,607,715 IN  
SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED  
STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER  
30, 2026, TO PROVIDE FUNDING FOR THE OPERATING EXPENSES OF  
THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH; GRANTS, SUBSIDIES, AND  
CONTRIBUTIONS; AND CAPITAL AND HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT;  
TO CHANGE THE ALLOTEE OF CERTAIN PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED  
FUNDS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

begs leave to report as follows:

The intent and purpose of this bill are expressed in its title.

The subject bill is a supplemental appropriations bill for  
Fiscal Year 2026 (FY2026).

On October 31, 2025, FSM Congress received Departmental Comm.  
No. 24-33, which featured an updated FY2026 revenue projection.

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The updated revenue projection reported no new domestic revenues, but reported \$1,000,000 in additional Compact Education Sector Grant funding, \$1,000,000 in additional Compact Public Sector Capacity Building (PSCB) Sector Grant funding, and \$282,705 in additional Compact Environment Sector Grant funding.

On November 7, 2025, FSM Congress received Presidential Comm. No. 24-167, which contained a draft FY2026 supplemental budget bill.

Your Committee held public hearings on Friday, November 7, 2025, and Monday, November 10, 2025, in the Congress Hearing Room, to discuss the updated revenue projection and the Executive's proposed supplemental budget bill. At these public hearings, your Committee spoke with numerous witnesses from the Executive Branch and certain outside agencies, including: the Office of the President, the Department of Finance and Administration, the Department of Justice, the Office of Compact Management, FSM Representatives to JEMCO, the Department of Health and Social Affairs, the Department of Resources and Development, the Department of Environment, Climate Change and Emergency Management; and the FSM Telecommunications Cable Corporation. On Tuesday, November 11, 2025, your Committee met internally to discuss the testimony received at the public hearings and to determine its plans for this supplemental budget. Based on its deliberations, your Committee recommends the following changes to Public Law No. 24-39, the original FY2026 budget bill:

- An appropriation of all available FY2026 Compact Sector Grant funds, including:
  - \$1,000,000 in Compact PSCB Sector Grant funds for Single Audit Fees and Cost (Section 8(12)(q))
  - \$1,000,000 in Compact Education Sector Grant funds for COM-FSM Operations (Section 9(1)(a))
  - \$282,705 in Compact Environment Sector Grant funds for Micronesia Cleanup Day Awareness Campaigns (Section 9(6)(f))
  - \$10 in previously unappropriated Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant (National Share) funds for COM-FSM IDP for Infrastructure (Section 9(1)(d))

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- An appropriation of \$250,000 in domestic revenue for Operation and Drydocking of Government-Operated Vessels (Section 9(4)(a))
- An appropriation of \$75,000 in domestic revenue for a new line item for the FSM Competent Authority (CA) (Section 9(8)(o))
- The transfer of the remaining fund balance (\$243,000) for the FSM Congress Medical Assistance Fund line item (Section 9(11)(f)) to the Speaker and Members: Contractual Services line item (Section 3(1): Contractual Services)
- A change in the allottee for Section 10 (Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant) line items, from the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, Communications and Infrastructure to the President of the Federated States of Micronesia

Your Committee notes that multiple requests from the Executive's draft supplemental budget bill are not recommended to be funded in this bill. Your Committee intends to revisit these and other budget requests during its next regular session, in January 2026.

Your Committee also notes that the updated revenue projection in Departmental Comm. No. 24-33 reports \$7,000,000 in newly available Compact II carryover funds. Your Committee engaged in detailed discussions regarding these carryover funds at its public hearings and at its internal meeting. Due to some of the legal concerns raised by members present at the public hearings, your Committee does not recommend appropriating the Compact II carryover funds at this time.

### **Conclusion**

Your Committee on Ways and Means has carefully reviewed and considered C.B. No. 24-92. Your Committee is in accord with the intent and purpose of C.B. No. 24-92, and recommends its passage on First Reading and that it be placed on the Calendar for Second and Final Reading in the form attached hereto.


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



A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 3, 8, 9, and 14 of Public Law No. 24-39, to appropriate \$2,607,715 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, to provide funding for the Operating Expenses of the Legislative Branch; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resource Development; to change the allottee of certain previously appropriated funds; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39 is hereby  
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as  
4 follows: To appropriate the sum of [~~\$130,536,291~~]  
5 \$133,144,006 from the General Fund of the Federated  
6 States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September  
7 30, 2026, for the purpose of funding the operations of  
8 all branches of the National Government; the operations

2 deemed to come from Compact Environment Sector Grant;  
3 \$619,030 shall be deemed to come from Compact Private  
4 Sector Development Sector Grant; [~~\$1,565,948~~] \$2,565,948  
5 shall be deemed to come from Compact Public Sector  
6 Capacity Building Sector Grant; \$280,000 shall be deemed  
7 to come from Compact Enhanced Reporting and  
8 Accountability Sector Grant; [~~\$34,999,990~~] \$35,000,000  
9 shall be deemed to come from Compact Infrastructure  
10 Sector Grant to be distributed to the National and State  
11 governments pursuant to the grant terms; and \$10,220,000  
12 shall be deemed to come from Compact IMF Grant to be  
13 deposited into the National and State IMF sub-accounts  
14 pursuant to the grant terms. The sum appropriated herein  
15 shall be apportioned as follows:"

15 "Section 14. Allotment and Management of Funds and Lapse

17 (1) General Provisions.

18 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
 19 allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for  
 20 in accordance with applicable law, including, but  
 21 not limited to, the Financial Management Act of  
 22 1979, as amended.

23 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for  
 24 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may

4       (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds appropriated
