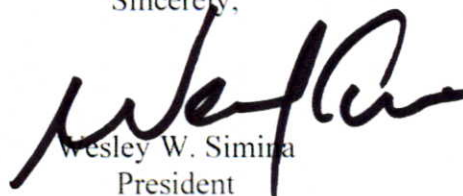

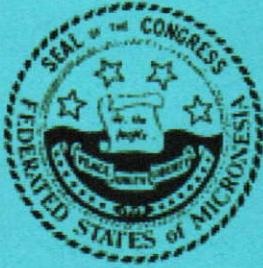

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 15-32, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78, 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-17, 18-67, 18-85, 18-104, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-34, 20-38, 21-144, 21-167, 22-163, and 23-92, by amending sections 1 and 2 thereof, for the use and purpose of changing the lapse date of certain funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs for the people of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei, and Chuuk States, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended
2 by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78,
3 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-
4 67, 18-104, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-38, 21-144 and 21-167,
5 is hereby further amended to read as follows:

6 "Section 1. The sum of \$3,780,000, or so much thereof,
7 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
8 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
9 ending September 30, 2008, for the purpose of funding
10 public projects and social programs for the people in
11 each state of the Federated States of Micronesia. The
12 fund shall be apportioned on the basis of \$250,000 or
13 less per member of Congress as follows; PROVIDED THAT,
14 an increase of \$300,000 is for Yap State.

2 Section 2 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended by Public
3 Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-57, 15-63, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-17, 18-
4 85, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-106, 21-34, 21-144, 22-163, and
5 23-92, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

6 "Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and
7 lapse date. All funds appropriated by this act shall
8 be allotted, managed, administered and accounted for
9 in accordance with applicable laws, including, but
10 not limited to the Financial Management Acts of each
11 of the States, the Financial Management Act of 1979
12 and the amended Compact of Free Association between
13 the United States Government and the Government of
14 the Federated States of Micronesia and its related
15 agreements. The allottee shall be responsible for
16 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may
17 be necessary, are used solely for the purpose
18 specified in this act, and that no obligations are
19 incurred in excess of the sum appropriated. The
20 allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection
21 (4)(a) of section 1 of this act shall be the Governor
22 of Chuuk State or his designee. The allottee of
23 funds appropriated under subsection 4(b) shall be the
24 Mortlock Islands Development Authority (MIDA). The
25 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections 4(c)

1 of this act shall be the Mayor of Weno Municipal
2 Government or his designee. The allottee of funds
3 appropriated under subsection 4(d) of this act shall
4 be the Southern Namoneas Development Authority. The
5 allottee of fund appropriated under subsection 4(e)
6 of this act shall be the Faichuk Development
7 Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under
8 subsections 1 and 3 of section 1 of this act shall be
9 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia
10 or his designee, EXCEPT THAT the allottee of the
11 funds appropriated under subsections (1)(a), (b),
12 (c), (d), (h), (j), (l) and (m) of section 1 of this
13 act shall be the Mayor of Lelu Municipal Government
14 and the allottee of funds appropriated under
15 subsection 1(1)(v) of this act shall be the Mayor of
16 Tafunsak Municipal Government or his designee. The
17 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 4(f)
18 of section 1 of this act shall be the Northwest
19 Islands Development Authority (NIDA). The allottee
20 of funds appropriated under subsection (2) of section
21 1 of this act shall be the Governor of the State of
22 Yap. The funds appropriated by this act shall lapse
23 on September 30, 2028.”

1 Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
3 becoming law without such approval.
