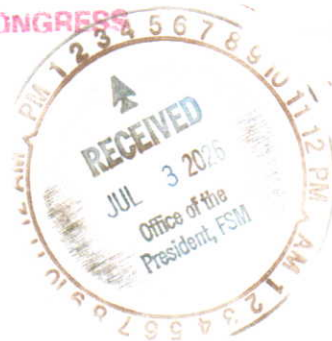

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 24-182, C.D.1

AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 24-46 and 24-55, to appropriate \$3,208,800 in supplemental funding from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 24-46 and 24-55, is hereby further amended to
3 read as follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is as
5 follows: To appropriate the sum of \$141,722,606 from
6 the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia
7 for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, for the
8 purpose of funding the operations of all branches of
9 the National Government; the operations of Independent
10 Offices; the operations of Agencies, Boards,
11 Authorities, and Commissions of the National
12 Government; Special Programs; Grants, Subsidies, and
13 Contributions; Capital and Human Resource Development;
14 Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant Projects and
15 Offices; and Compact IMF Grant Distributions. Of the
16 total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$7,119,994
17 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector
18 Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact

PUBLIC LAW No. 24- 98

1 Health Sector Grant; \$765,248 shall be deemed to come
2 from Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall
3 be deemed to come from Compact Private Sector
4 Development Sector Grant; \$2,565,948 shall be deemed
5 to come from Compact Public Sector Capacity Building
6 Sector Grant; \$280,000 shall be deemed to come from
7 Compact Enhanced Reporting and Accountability Sector
8 Grant; \$38,299,800 shall be deemed to come from
9 Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant to be distributed
10 to the National and State governments pursuant to the
11 grant terms; and \$10,220,000 shall be deemed to come
12 from Compact IMF Grant to be deposited into the
13 National and State IMF sub-accounts pursuant to the
14 grant terms. The sum appropriated herein shall be
15 apportioned as follows:"

16 Section 2. Section 2 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended
17 by Public Laws Nos. 24-46 and 24-55, is hereby further amended
18 to read as follows:

19 "Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive
20 Branch. The sum of \$37,916,725, or so much thereof as
21 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
22 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
23 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, for the
24 purpose of funding the operations of the Executive
25 Branch of the National Government during the fiscal

year 2026. Of the total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$555,411 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector Grant; \$410,485 shall be deemed to come from Compact Health Sector Grant; \$422,543 shall be deemed to come from Compact Environment Sector Grant; \$619,030 shall be deemed to come from Compact Private Sector Development Sector Grant; and \$280,000 shall be deemed to come from Compact Enhanced Reporting and Accountability Sector Grant. The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

Section 6. Section 9 of Public Law No. 24-39, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 24-46 and 24-55, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 9. Capital and Human Resource Development.

The sum of \$17,352,739, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2026, for the following capital improvements, development programs, and other projects. Of the total amount of funds appropriated herein, \$5,564,583 shall be deemed to come from Compact Education Sector Grant, \$1,941,665 shall be deemed to come from the Compact Infrastructure Sector Grant, and \$342,705 shall be deemed to come from the Compact Environment Sector Grant. The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as follows:
